Squirrels and Seagulls

I had an interesting conversation while hiking with a friend. A little grey squirrel darted into our path and my friend exclaimed how she hated squirrels. I thought hate was a strong emotion towards these creatures that our Father God created, but as she described how squirrels constantly tear up her gardens, I began to understand where her hostile feelings came from.

It's like how I felt for some time about seagulls. One day, while visiting my daughter in Vancouver, we had stopped for lunch and I decided that I would have my first taste of authentic seaside fish and chips. I purchased my lunch at an outdoor venue, wandered out to the patio to find a picnic table and was viciously accosted by a group of seagulls. They devoured my lunch within seconds. I did not think favourable thoughts towards seagulls for quite some time.

These two simple examples of how we can form unfavourable opinions or feelings about something may seem quite innocent, however these same types of thoughts when formed about someone made in God's image, become extremely dangerous. In either case, the description of these feelings falls under the title of prejudice. The results of prejudicial feelings about a person or people group has huge implications. One only needs to turn on the daily news to see how far-reaching and utterly devastating the effects of prejudicial actions are in our world.

In reading the story found in Acts 8:26-39 I was intrigued by the way Phillip was obedient to the Spirit's command to approach the Ethiopian eunuch. This was possibly someone who Phillip would not have normally interacted with. The gentleman was from a different race. Yet, in verse 30 it says that Phillip ran up to the chariot. Who knows what Phillip's agenda may have been for that day, but he certainly tossed it out the window. What a display of obedience to God's call. Phillip took the time to interact with the Ethiopian gentleman. He asked the eunuch if he understood what he was reading from the book of Isaiah and then he shared the good news about Jesus with him. Phillip continued to travel with his new brother in Christ until they came to some water and then Phillip baptized him. We see no hesitation on the part of Phillip interacting with someone from another culture. Phillip listened, he discerned, he shared, and he took all the time that was needed to win this soul for Christ. As far as I can see, if Phillip had any pre-conceived feelings about this man, there is no evidence that anything, but the love of Christ was displayed.

May Jesus help us to love the way He loves, with abandonment and grace. For God so loved the whole world that He gave His all. May we in turn display love for all that He made ... perhaps that even includes squirrels and seagulls, but most certainly it includes all those made in His image.
