## O Holy Night

"O holy night! The stars are brightly shining; it is the night of our dear Saviour's birth. Long lay the world in sin and error pining, till He appeared, and the soul felt its worth."

It's hard to imagine that these lyrics were written in 1847, and yet, they have survived the test of time. The relevance of this beautiful Christmas carol touches my aching heart this Christmas.

As the words; "A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices, for yonder breaks a new and glorious morn" run through my mind, emotions spill and tears flow. The significance behind these lines sinks into the core of my soul. This has always been one of my favourite Christmas carols, but today it takes on a whole new meaning.

In these past days the world is grieving the tragedy that took place at the *Tree of Life Synagogue* in Pittsburgh. Just imagine if the place where you worship your God was turned into a killing field. *"Long lay the world in sin and error pining"* ... could we express it any better?

The lyrics to this most beloved carol were written in France at the request of a forgotten parish priest, by a poet who would later split from the church. The music was written by a composer of Jewish ancestry, and in fact, this beloved hymn was at one time uniformly denounced by the church. It was later brought to America to serve as a tool to highlight the sinful nature of slavery. "Truly He taught us to love one another; His law is love and His gospel is peace. Chains He shall break, for the slave is our brother; and in His name all oppression shall cease."

On Christmas Eve 1906, Reginald Fessenden spoke into a microphone and for the first time in history, a man's voice was broadcast over the airwaves. In a clear, strong voice he read the account of the birth of our Saviour from the gospel of Luke. He then picked up his violin and played "O Holy Night" which was the first song ever sent through the air via radio waves.

Perhaps the most meaningful of all the lines of this hymn may be ... "Fall on your knees, O hear the angels' voices ... O night divine, O night when Christ was born."

There it is ... the sweet hope, the deep joy, the ever-constant, never-ending, unchanging truth of the gospel! We can rise from our knees, from our pining, from our grief, from our despair, and with one voice sing: "Sweet hymns of joy in grateful chorus raise we, let all within us praise His holy name. Christ is the Lord! O praise His Name forever, His power and glory evermore proclaim. His power and glory evermore proclaim!"
