President's Report Regional Conference 2017

"the Comforter will come..." John 16

For this past year I have been working, writing, teaching and preaching on the theme of the person and the work of the Holy Spirit. Yet, as I moved through the many teaching experiences, I began to realize there was another reason.

In John 14-16, Jesus is preparing His disciples to face the many stressors that all change brings. There was the coming mission which would be a major transition, which was to have a great effect.

This is the year of transition, and my prayer is that we will all be filled with the Spirit of the Godhead as we move into a greater future. Transitions are important, and it will take great wisdom to navigate the many changes that will mold the future direction, influence and effectiveness of the AGC in Canada and around the world. Everything must be done to the glory of God and honour of the Lord Jesus.

2017-18 will be a year of introducing changes that need to happen as we move ahead. Changes effect everyone and, unfortunately, at times, some more than others.

THANKS:

I want to begin by thanking our staff across the nation. Donna, Susan, Glenn, Del, Laird, Russ and Lorne have been so instrumental in thinking through the processes of needed change. Streamlining and creating efficiencies have been upper most, as we sought to develop healthy systems, policies and structures.

The National Board and Councils have gone over many of the proposed changes and have been very supportive in helping to shape these changes. The National and Regional Commission leaders have been challenging, resourceful and supportive of changes that mostly effect their roles and their services. Thanks to everyone who served in the Commissions over 2016-17. I especially want to acknowledge Paul Brittan and Hill Park Bible Church in Hamilton for the seventeen years Hill Park congregation and leadership have consistently allowed Paul to serve in every role that Doc Cred has in the AGC. Paul has been a part of shaping who we are today. Paul, we want to thank you and to honour you, LaFaye and Hill Park.

REVIEW of 2016-17

Church Renewal Conference:

Russ, Lorne and I together with many friends attended Southland Church in Steinbach Manitoba. We were deeply touched by the work of the Holy Spirit creating honest and open confession and repentance of sin. In addition, we experienced 'listening prayer'. CRC has asked me to speak at two conferences here in Kitchener and Toronto about our time with CRC. I have invited our AGC Ontario pastors to join me in these events.

Most of the initiatives have been in the pursuit of our three Commissions goals.

- The Healthy Leader Healthy Church analysis is operational across the country.
- In addition, our staff have been trained in the Son Life discipleship program called 4 Chair Discipleship. This certification has been acquired and we are beginning to do training.
- Initial work has begun on a nearly decade long "We See" statements. We are proposing to have over the next year, three AGC specific Leadership Institutes across Canada. One at Fair Havens, one in Winnipeg and one in Calgary.
- Lorne Meisner has joined the National team as Associated Superintended under Russ Wilson. Lorne has specific duties to care for the Manitoba churches and pastors. This hire is also part of our on-going desire to build strategic alliances, in this case with the BGC.
- Glenn Goode has resigned from his duties as overseer of our AGC Nova Scotia churches. This fall we will be interviewing a retired Baptist pastor as a potential to replace Glenn. This would continue our decade long alliance with the FEBC Maritimes.

- Last fall the AGC was given Ellis Ave church building through the generosity of Compass Point Bible Church. The Finance Committee is overseeing the eventual sale or long term lease of the building and decisions should be made by June 30,2017. Any funds coming from this property will be designated toward Church Reproduction.

I look forward to the Commissions reports of new Church Reproductions and new pastors joining our ranks.

AGC RESTRUCTURE:

For the past three SUMMITS, we have been discussing the need to build capacity, move to greater effectiveness through staffing and look creatively as to what the churches and Denominations should look like in Canada. As a result, we have presented to the Executive, to the National Board and to the three Councils a proposal on how to re-structure the governance of the AGC to make it more streamlined, effective and efficient.

The National Board has agreed to take the next twelve months until SUMMIT 2018 to begin to roll out the implementation of the structural changes and evaluate its progress and effectiveness. The Regional Councils will be encouraged and empowered to develop initiatives representative of their own regions toward the Mission and Vision of AGC.

This evaluation period will help the National Board assess implementing a Policy Governance model. In the fall of 2017 or pre-summit 2018 we will have a day to educate every Board member to the function of Policy Board procedures.

AGC Proposed Justice and Compassion Partnerships:

Refugees: Susan Davis

International:

1. India: I am planning together with Raj Sandhu to travel and teach in India with our partnership with the Good Shepherd ministries and Dalit Freedom Network. This will be Sept 29 – Oct 12, 2017.
2. Kenya: May 2018 planning for my final trip to Kenya with Raj and a team from AGC. This will be to celebrate the handover to a new AGC Kenya President from John Juma to Zack Mendez. We continue with pastoral training.
3. DRC: 25 churches still doing well and we are hoping to begin pastoral training soon. Great need for bible resources.
4. Haiti: Work progressing. Major need right now is funding for a Technical Training School.

CONCLUSIONS:

As I enter my last year as AGC president, I do so with a glad and grateful heart. Stepping back brings both sadness and a deep sense of seeing and supporting a new president. This may be the greatest transition of all, but it is also the most important, so we need to be united in prayer and support. God is blessing the work of AGC, both in Canada and Internationally and we need to be thankful for God's faithfulness to us as a team of staff and volunteers.

CANADA WEST SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT CONFERENCE 2017

(Canada West Regional Director)

Greetings and welcome to our first ever Canada West Conference in Manitoba. It has long been our tradition to bounce back and forth between Alberta and Saskatchewan hosting our conferences due to mileage for our other two provinces. However, we decided to move beyond tradition so we are excited to have Pastor Myron Friesen and our MacGregor Church host us for 2017.

Last year at this same time we had numerous churches either looking for pastors or about to begin looking for pastors and I wasn't feeling too great about our overall situation. I am so happy to report that things have turned around significantly for us here in the west. Let me list off what has transpired (with the hope that I don't miss anyone)

1. Biggar AGC has hired Pastor Doug Motz
2. Grace Bible Church in Dauphin has hired Pastor Richard Heppner
3. Parkland Bible Church in Kipling has hired Pastor Chad Garris
4. Estevan Gospel Chapel has hired Pastor Terry Wicks

We have several churches in the process of pursuing selected candidates for their church positions. Trinity Bible Church in Canmore and Silver Heights Bible Church in Weyburn have narrowed their searches and we hope to be able to soon celebrate with them.

Churches currently looking for pastors are Emmanuel Grace Church in Eastend, Saskatchewan, Faith Gospel Fellowship in Fort Vermilion, Alberta and Church of the Open Bible in Ponoka, Alberta. Hans Elgby has recently resigned from Maryfield AGC so they will be soon looking for a new pastor as well.

Rev. Kevin Kurtz at Crossroads Church in Calgary and Rev. Bryce Letkeman at Black Diamond Gospel Chapel were ordained within this past calendar year.

Fairview Gospel Chapel in Fairview Alberta with Pastor Dave Brisbin have completed their application to transition from a One Hope Alberta Church to our association. We are just waiting on a date to celebrate with them and to officially welcome them into the AGC. We have another church in McCreary, Manitoba in the process of making application to join the AGC as well. These are exciting times within the western region of our association.

We are also pleased to have our new Associate Regional Superintendent, Rev. Lorne Meisner, join our AGC staff in January of this year. Lorne has been a great addition to our team. He is hired on with us at a .25 position with responsibilities to cover our Manitoba churches. Lorne is also employed by the Baptist General Conference at .75 to cover their churches in Manitoba as their District Coach. You will have an opportunity to get to know Lorne a bit better during our conference days together.

Lorne, myself and our Ontario Regional Superintendent, Rev. Laird Crump traveled to Orlando, Florida in January to receive training in the Four Chair Discipleship Seminar. All three of us are certified seminar presenters now. We share the same philosophy to discipleship so this training was key for us as an association. Please be sure to take in Lorne's introductory seminar on 4 Chair Discipling which will be offered on Saturday afternoon at our conference if you want more information about this approach to basic Christian disciple making.

Our national leadership team has been working on an AGC Church and Leader Development Program. This will include 5, 3-day residencies which will equip our leaders and build upon each module. We will be unpacking this training in more detail in this coming year. For those who want to see more information about this training I will have the materials with me at conference.

Our Western Region Council Chairman Brian Unger, Susan Davis and myself were recently in Ontario for National Board meetings. During those days, the National Board decided that we begin to put into place a new structure for the AGC. You will be hearing more about that during our business session on Saturday. We also had an update from the Presidential Search Committee and we look forward to the final candidate being presented to us as an Association at the appropriate time. Please keep these people in your prayers as they seek for God's best candidate to be brought to us.

God is at work within our association and it is my great privilege to serve our pastors, church boards and churches through the ups and downs of ministry life. Thank you for letting me serve you in these past twelve months.

Church Health and Leadership Report

The focus for Church Health and Leadership for 2017 will be on providing resources for our Pastors; both of our Superintendents (Associate Superintendent Lorne Meisner and Superintendent Russ Wilson) have been providing our Pastors with opportunities to attend various conferences and seminars that include helpful resources and spiritual renewal. Along with those opportunities, I hope that our Area Cluster Groups and our Refresh retreat can be additional sources of encouragement and exhortation for our Pastors.

Our Area Cluster Groups in the West have been a source of great encouragement to me in the years I have spent in ministry in the AGC; our goal for the Cluster Groups is to promote discipleship through connecting experienced Pastors ("grumpy old men"- i.e. Myron Friesen) with younger Pastors ("whippersnappers"- i.e. Bryce Letkeman). In our local Pastors group here in Manitoba, I can't say enough for the effect Randy Fehr has had on me, and the other Pastors in Manitoba. Randy is a consistent source of encouragement and wisdom, and is willing to share with us from his years of experience to help us better understand our people, our ministries, and ourselves. This is an example of what I hope for each of the Area Cluster groups- that the wise among us might have opportunity to disciple those in need of wisdom. Along with that primary goal, we also hope to work with our Area Pastors to offer (at least once a year) a more structured Area Cluster meeting for each area that might include resources on a specific topic and perhaps a guest speaker to address that topic, when it best suits the Area Cluster group. More details on that to follow in the coming weeks and months.

Refresh 2017 planning is in full swing; I had the opportunity to meet recently with Phil Houston to discuss our goals and focus for Refresh, and I left very excited about what the Lord has laid on our hearts for that retreat. It will take place in early November once again, and we will have further details, including registration information, either at Canada West Conference or in the very near future.

I have also spoken with Russ Wilson about the possibility of offering a Training Seminar for our Pastors in the West; Russ would like to make the event available to all our Pastors, so we will likely host one in the Western part of the region, and another in the eastern part of the region. Again, further details to be made available shortly.

Thank you to all of you who have made my time in CHL such a joy; it really is an honour to have opportunity to serve on Council, and I've learned so much from those in leadership. Thanks especially to Brian Unger for leading our meetings and to Russ and Lorne for shepherding our shepherds with care and love.

Doctrine and Credentials Commission Report

"For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: 'The righteous will live by faith'" (Romans 1:17; NIV).

In case you hadn't heard, October 31st, of this year, will mark an historic anniversary! No, it has nothing to do with the stock-market, an elected official, cosmic alignments, or end-of-the-world predictions. Yet, it's really hard to say if it will draw much attention in the mainstream media, or if it will even garner the interest of those who have been affected most by its inauguration.

On October 31st, 1517, a 34-year old parish priest—armed with hammer and nails in hand, and clutching a large free-hand poster—emerged from the church vestibule. Then, suddenly, as if without warning, he affixed the document to the church door!

Months earlier, a crisis of faith had occurred in this young man's life. Of his experience, he wrote—"At last meditating day and night, by the mercy of God, I began to understand that the righteousness of God is that through which the righteous live by a gift of God, namely by faith. Here I felt as if I were entirely born again and had entered paradise itself through the gates that had been flung open."

Of what and of whom, is this strange account? The church was located at Wittenberg, Germany, the young man was Martin Luther by name, and the day marked the beginning of the Protestant Reformation—the day he nailed his famous "Ninety-Five Theses" to the church door. This day changed his life dramatically—and, it would change church history forever!

Church historian, Philip Schaff wrote, "The Protestant Reformation of the sixteenth century is, next to the introduction of Christianity, the greatest event in history. It marks the end of the Middle Ages and the beginning of modern times. Starting from religion, it gave, directly or indirectly, a mighty impulse to every forward movement, and made Protestantism the chief propelling force in the history of modern civilization."

The Protestant Reformation focused on five of the most important elements of Christianity. These five elements constitute the very core of what it has meant historically to be evangelical. [The five marks of the Protestant Church may not apply to all churches falling under this title, but they do express the driving theological convictions of the early Reformers—including Luther, Zwingli, and Calvin.]

"Scripture Alone." This phrase reflects the conviction that Scripture alone is authoritative for Christian doctrine. The assurance that God has spoken to believers directly through his holy Scriptures gave the Reformers their unique boldness. Final and sufficient knowledge rested in the Bible—that is, Scripture alone, in contrast to Scripture plus anything else parallel to the Scriptures, whether it be the Church tradition or a natural theology.

"Christ Alone." God's grace and our faith are "in Christ alone" (John 14:6; Acts 4:12; Ephesians 1:7; Romans 5:12–21). The salvation we enjoy had to be earned, and it was Christ who earned it. In the divine solution, Christ was the righteous one who alone could satisfy every demand of the offended righteousness of God. The cross of Christ is presented in holy Scripture as the declaration of the very righteousness of God (Romans 3:25). Through that cross, God was in Christ reconciling the world unto himself (2 Corinthians 5:19).

"Faith Alone." It is through faith in Jesus Christ that the sinner is justified. God justifies the one 'who believes in Jesus' (Romans 3:26; 5:1; Galatians 2:16). It is not through faith and human works that we are justified but through faith alone. However, it is not mere faith that saves, but faith in Christ. Faith in any other savior but Christ, will not save. Faith in any other gospel than that of the New Testament, will not save (Galatians 1:8, 9).

One is saved only on the basis of the finished work of Christ as He died in space and time in history, and the only way to be saved is to raise the empty hands of faith and, by God's grace, to accept God's free gift—faith alone.

"Grace Alone." Salvation is God's work, the result of God's unmerited favor. Salvation is by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone. He came to be the Lamb without spot, who, by sacrifice of himself, made once forever, should take away the sin of the world.... Because of human depravity, we cannot save ourselves. It is by God's grace alone that salvation is possible. God is right to call humankind to account for sin. However, by his grace, undeserving people will be united in fellowship with him and avoid judgment. Without God's grace, no one could come into relationship with God. Relationship with God is peace, joy, and eternal life itself (John 17:3; Ephesians 2:8-9).

"To the Glory of God Alone." The significance of the phrase is twofold: first, that God's supreme end in planning, purchasing, and applying salvation is his own glory (Ephesians 1:6); second, that therefore the chief end and intention of those who have received God's saving grace in Christ is to bring glory to him (1 Corinthians 10:31; Revelation 4:11). As Charles Simeon wrote—"What you were, is all that you can call yours; what you are, is the gift of sovereign grace, to the praise and glory of God alone."
