Blessed Be Your Name

One very windy day, while walking along the lakefront, I paused to reflect. The waves were high, and the winds howled, yet these gusts were nothing in comparison to what people experience in life-altering storms. We've all experienced sadness, suffering and pain. Throughout the world, people face the devastating loss of life and property because of powerful natural disasters, wars, and famines.

The song *Blessed Be Your Name* came to mind as I continued my walk. How glibly we may sing these words especially when the "streams of abundance flow." But what happens when tragedy and heartache strike, and we find ourselves in a desert place? Perhaps we've all faced a dark night of the soul, but what if we lost everything? If bombs wiped out our everyday way of life or if we were persecuted for our faith, could we still smile and enthusiastically sing "Blessed be Your name"? Paul and Silas did exactly that while in prison. "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them" (Acts 16:25). What a witness these men displayed of trusting in God no matter the circumstances!

I pray that we will be still and ponder the depth and truth of the words we sing while we worship. It's o.k. to lament before moving into an attitude of praise. While grieving we should feel the freedom to lament before our God of grace and mercy. The Psalms are filled with deeply felt prayers we can use when we don't have the words to express our grief. *"Listen to my words, Lord, consider my lament. Hear my cry for help, my King, and my God,"* (Ps. 5: 1,2).

We can be thankful for those days when the sun is shining down on us and the world's 'all that it should be'. Yet, God is faithful even on the road marked with suffering. By God's grace and in His strength whether with tears of sorrow or joy, our hearts can truly sing, "*Blessed be The Name of the Lord*."
