## The Greatest Story

Don't you just love a good story? There have been many famous storytellers down through the centuries. You likely have your favourites. Even as an adult, I still appreciate the way Lucy Maude Montgomery imaginatively composed her delightful stories. These are the type of books that can be cracked open again. That's a great testament to a good story. Recently, I read *Love Does* by Bob Goff. I think Bob has a way of weaving simple illustrations into profound Gospel truths. He has a great sense of humour, which is artfully used at just the right moment. Charles Swindoll also uses humour in his unique way of communicating a message. He models how to use a story to bridge the gap between people and generations.

Mister Rogers was a masterful storyteller. Fred used his gift to help teach valuable life lessons. With a quiet and humble spirit, he shared stories that spread love and kindness. It is not surprising that he had previously been ordained as a pastor. Pastors are often good storytellers.

Perhaps you have memories of sitting around a campfire listening to an old family tale. If you happen to be north of fifty, you may recall a different type of storytelling. Times of testimony were held in Sunday services. People would share the story of how they came to faith in Jesus. I will never forget an elderly gentleman who always sprang to his feet to sing the chorus, "He Touched Me." That was his story in song.

However, the greatest story ever told is written in the Scriptures, that is the story of Jesus. Jesus was a master storyteller. His use of parables as a method of revealing truths about human behaviour is incredible. Think of just one example, The Prodigal Son – it contains many characters we can relate to. We can see God's love revealed through the Father and come to a better understanding of God's patience. We may relate to the wayward child or the jealous sibling. There are so many truths woven into this one story which motivates us to examine our hearts.

Recently while reading John's Gospel account, the following verse was illuminated to me in a brand-new way. "Jesus did many other things as well. If every one of them were written down, I suppose that even the whole world would not have room for the books that would be written" (John 21:25). That sounds like a lot of great stories!

There are untold stories that never made it into Scripture. Someday, we may be able to hear them all. In the meantime, let's keep telling the story of a Saviour – the story that never gets old. There is always a soul that longs to hear the truth that is found in the greatest story ever told. We all have a story to tell!
